



Neonatal Transfer Service

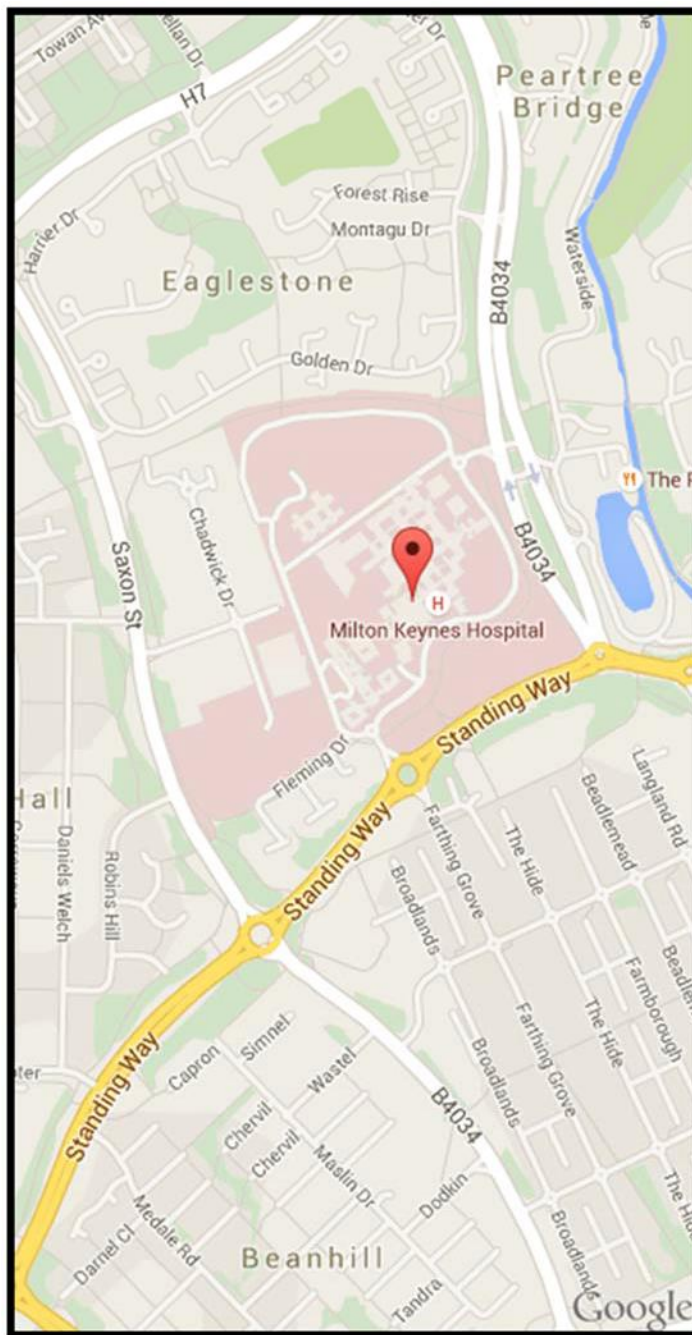
The team who come to transfer your baby will introduce themselves to you and explain how they will transfer your baby. They are a specialist team trained to care for sick newborn and premature babies. There will be a Doctor/ ANNP, Neonatal Nurse and an Ambulance Driver, all of which are specially trained in neonatal transport.

The ambulance carrying your baby will have all the necessary specialist equipment to continue your baby's care and ensure their safe transfer to your local neonatal unit.

By Rail

The hospital is a short distance from 'Milton Keynes Central station'. This is on the West Coast main line route and is served by Virgin West Coast Trains and Silverlink Train services.

By Bus

The hospital is well served by local bus routes. Bus services 29 and 32 serve the hospital site, stopping adjacent to the hospital main entrance.

Catering/refreshments

The Eaglestone Restaurant provides hot and cold meals, teas, coffees and snacks.

Local catering outlets/shops

The hospital has an on-site shop, run by the Friends of Milton Keynes Hospital and Community. It sells a range of newspapers, magazines, refreshments, gifts and cash point.

Other shops include Costa, Subway and Little fresh Shop.

Religious Support

A place for a quiet moment of reflection - everyone is welcome. Ask a member of the nursing team for directions. The nursing team can also arrange for you to talk with a member of the chaplaincy.

Access to interpreters
